Cardinal Kung, A Defender of the Faith Scholarships



To honor Ignatius Cardinal Kung Pin-Mei's heroic fidelity to the Church (1901-2000), The Cardinal Kung Foundation is pleased to offer Cardinal Kung, A Defender of The Faith Scholarships:

- 1. Students who plan on a Fall 2024 entry to a college recommended in the 2023 Newman Guide:
 - Scholarship award of \$2,000 will be awarded to one (1) high school senior
 - Additional awards of \$1000 each may be awarded to outstanding applicants, at the discretion of the Foundation.
- 2. Students attending high school in the academic year 2024-5, including homeschooled students:
 - Scholarship awards of \$500 will be awarded at the discretion of the Foundation.

Ignatius Cardinal Kung Pin-Mei, Bishop of Shanghai, China was a renowned educator in Shanghai, and a prisoner for Christ for thirty-two years under the Chinese communist government. Saint Pope John Paul II named him Cardinal *in pectore* in 1979 while he was serving a life sentence in China. He was later publicly proclaimed Cardinal in 1991. Saint Pope John Paul II referred to Cardinal Kung as "*a man who has given witness by word and deed, through long suffering and trials, to what constitutes the essence of Life in the Church, participation in the divine life through the apostolic faith and evangelical love.*"

Prior to his arrest in 1955, Bishop Kung engaged in practical activities to prepare himself and the Church in Shanghai for coming persecutions. He visited all parishes to encourage weekly devotions such as adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, public recitation of the rosary, and praying the Passion of the Cross. He strengthened the catechetical training in all parishes to enable the faithful to defend their faith against communism. He vigorously trained hundreds of lay Catholics, especially youth, as catechists to pass on the faith to future generations when clergy and nuns would be jailed or martyred.

In honor of Cardinal Kung's commitment to practical activity in the service of Christ and His Church, the scholarship awards will be made based on the student's demonstrated commitment to actively promoting and defending the Catholic faith.

The decisions of the Cardinal Kung Foundation will be final. All submitted documents become the property of the Cardinal Kung Foundation. The Cardinal Kung Foundation reserves the right to publish the names of the college scholarship recipients, the essays, and the name of the school or parish. The Cardinal Kung Foundation will not publish the names of the high school scholarship winners without the explicit approval of the winner's parents.

APPLICATION

Applicants must show *excellence in living, promoting and defending* the Catholic faith. Excellence can be shown with a consistent record of service to the Church. For example:

Leading efforts to promote the Catholic faith or preparing for this service

Organizing or participating in events on living the Catholic faith in family, school or parish

Teaching the Catholic faith to younger students

Engaging in discussions and debates about faith

Studying the faith diligently for the sake of working with this knowledge in the future.

Scholarship Application Requirements:

Documents must include those listed below and be submitted as <u>PDF file</u> attachments (with **College Scholarship** or **High School Scholarship** in the Subject line) to: <u>cardinalkungfdn@gmail.com</u> Document title syntax should be as follows:

- 1. A **cover sheet** listing the following: Applicant's full name, address, e-mail address, telephone number, name and address of the high school, graduation date, name of college or university in Fall 2023, and age.
- 2. A resume of pertinent activities.
- 3. A **400-600-word essay**, written by the applicant, that details the applicant's current activities defending the Church, leading efforts to promote the Catholic faith, or by preparing such a service. The essay must explain why the applicant has chosen to devote time to these activities.
- 4. At least one **confidential letter of recommendation** from someone, preferable not a family member who is familiar with the applicant's activity as a defender of the faith. The letter must be **emailed directly to the Foundation from the writer,** and should attest to the applicant's practicality in serving the Church and his or her commitment in defending the faith.
- 5. Timeline for both categories: Submissions will be accepted beginning December 1, 2023 and will be accepted until <u>11:59 PM Eastern Time on January 14, 2024</u>. Documents emailed after the deadline will not be accepted. The awards will be announced on the anniversary of Cardinal Kung's death, March 12, 2024 and will be posted on the Cardinal Kung Foundation's website: <u>http://www.cardinalkungfoundation.org</u>

College Scholarship recipients will agree to read a biography of Cardinal Kung (provided by the Foundation), to allow their names, a brief bio, and the Newman college of their choice to be posted on the Foundation's website, and to submit to the Foundation by <u>June 1, 2024</u>, for the Foundation's possible publication, a brief statement (100 words or less) that provides some insight into the benefits gained through the award and through reading the Cardinal's biography.

High School Scholarship recipients will agree to read a biography of Cardinal Kung (provided by the Foundation).

The Scholarship Payments:

The **College Scholarships** will be paid directly to the Newman Guide college in which the student enrolls as a tuition, or a room and board payment, or for books required for college coursework.

High School Scholarships will be paid directly to the high school or homeschool program, or will be paid directly to the family upon submission of receipts for homeschooling expenses.

Failure to provide proof of enrollment by June 1, 2024 will result in forfeiture of the award.
